### Cultivation

We (Gundel, Peter and Lelio) manage and cultivate 4,5 ha of farmland in Hasendorf according to Demeter guidelines (presently in transition). We grow over 60 different varieties of vegetables of all types, as well as diverse culinary herbs. Our objective is to grow diverse vegetables for diverse people according to their individual needs, while maintaining respect for land, plants, animals and humans. The crop development is based on whatever interests us or you. These interests are incorporated into our work processes.

The greater collaborative goal is the preservation and further development of a sustainably operated, small farm that cares for the earth and water supply, and preserves and protects natural bio-diversity, while enabling the viability of a varied, living cultural landscape.

### **Financing**

SOLAWI ACKERSCHÖN is not profit-driven; our main goal is to provide the best possible supply for all those involved. The community thereby accepts higher production costs, due to the absence of hybrid varieties, through small-scale cultivation, combined with the care of the vegetable varieties. The harvest sharers cover the costs of a business year through their contributions. The crop planning and the budget of the coming year are aimed at providing approximately 80 households with vegetables.

### **Distribution and Organisation**

The vegetable year begins slowly, as does Nature, with a small selection of winter vegetables and salads and a distribution every 2 weeks, beginning in February. From mid- to late March (depending on the development of the vegetation) the harvest is distributed on a weekly basis, and the varieties increase continually, until they reach their richest amounts in the summer and autumn. At the pick-up stands, the vegetables are prepared as at a market. The selection and collection of the vegetables is open, according to individual needs, the available amounts, and a consciousness of solidarity and fairness for all members. One harvest share should comprise a complete vegetable supply for a vegetarian, or for a small family with a mixed diet, who mainly cook on weekends. Half-shares (for example, for single people with less need for vegetables) are also possible. The share allotment cannot be interrupted during the contracted period, although a share can be transferred to a friend or neighbor in the case of your absence (as long as the above information is clear to that person). Harvest interruptions – for example, due to insects, storms or frost –are to be shouldered out of solidarity as a group. We look forward to any kind of cooperation; in our regular workgroup meetings, in the fields (at harvesting times), or as helpers for our distribution.
